Reduce Child Abuse 90% by 2030 in one U.S. county – Lane County, Oregon

Population

(2018): 379,611

Area: 4,620 sq. miles

Adults: 291,162

Children 0-17 - 69,848

Children 0-5 - 18,601

5:1 ratio of adults to children

Lane County Child Abuse reports (2018)9,007 reports

Child abuse statewide reports 84,233 (2018)



Theory of Change: Broad View

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- Chosen and led by engaged, local communities (place-based, base building)
- Implementing a blend of proven strategies (scale-down)
- Mapped to and focused on boosting protective factors
- + population-level social norms change



Fosters the conditions for child abuse prevention:

Kids are connected Families are supported Community members take positive action



4. Finalize Strategic Plan in Region – Year 3
Choose Strategies - Fill in Gaps - Identify Funds

3. Inventory Community – Year 2
Identify Risk & Protective Factors - Asset Mapping - Gap identification

2. Collect Data – Year 2
Community Data Project: 200-400 Adult Community Surveys per Region


1. Organize Regional Leadership Team (RLT) – Year 1
Up to 25 people - Build Team - Determine Structure - Reflect regional demographics

- Welcome our Neighbors: Neighborhood-based in partnership (locally developed)









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

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






Oregon Child Abuse Prevalence Survey (OCAPS)

Join the National Conversation on Child Abuse and Neglect <u>Physical abuse experience types</u> include questions like: 1) "Has anyone ever chocked you and prevented you from breathing?" and 2) "Has anyone ever hit you over and over again with an object or fist (beat-up)?"



52% of students
reported at least one
type of physical abuse
by adults; 39%
experienced four or
more types of physical
abuse.
